

BOOKING YOUR TRIP

- To book, file an inquiry online with our submission form found on our website. Any calls for bookings will be directed to this address to file a formal request for fieldtrip: <https://museumofthedog.org/events-and-education/childrens-programs>.
- Fieldtrips cost \$110/class for schools within New York City and \$150/class for non-NYC schools.
- A class can have up to 30 students and 3 free adults. Additional adults can join for \$13 per person.
- Fieldtrips are available Tuesday-Friday in morning and afternoon sessions.
- Please allow the Museum Staff one week before reaching out for a response, to ease coordination.

SELF-GUIDED TRIPS

Explore the Museum on your own without a structured visit. Self-guided tours are available Tuesday–Friday for groups with a minimum of 10 children. Reservations must be made at least three weeks prior to the tour date and are based on availability. Self-Guided trips are available at the group rates for individual tickets:

**PAWS TO PLAY:
Pre-K-First Grade**

This guided field trip for early childhood learners built to spark interest in reading at an early age and reinforce social behaviors at school through the topic of dogs. Children will interact with a therapy dog during their visit to experience their calming nature and benefits while reading as a group. Participate in story time and crafts to reaffirm colors, counting, and other concepts in the classroom.

**PATTERNS ON PUPS:
First through Second Grade**

Brush up on shapes and colors studying some of the largest and most vibrant paintings in our collection! Work with felt and other materials to create your own abstract art depicting dogs and exploring cubism. Encourage creativity and self-expression with your class in the comfort of the Museum!

**BONES, BONES, BONES:
Grades 3rd -7th Grade**

(Content Adjustable to Age Group*)

A true and rare treasure to the Museum is the loan of a full skeleton of the Wire Fox Terrier, Belgrave Joe. Bones, Bones, Bones encourages teamwork while developing critical thinking skills. Children are welcome to examine, measure, and learn about the function of dog bodies through guided visit. Learn how different breeds of dog are adept at different skills based on body type!



ADJUSTABLE CONTENT:

- Science and Math skills are developed using a 3D printed version of Belgrave Joe! Using this replica, children have the opportunity to practice measuring, finding weight of real bones, and converting measurements to real bones
- Incorporate additional concepts such as locomotion and comparative anatomy to supplement the experience to your grade level.



**CANINES IN HISTORY:
4th-7th Grade**

Supplement your learning in the classroom with dogs throughout history. This guided fieldtrip tours sculptures and artifacts from famous dog mascots as you delve into the history of canines in the military and of dogs in the White House! Discover the critical roles dogs played in their support, both physical and emotional, during wars in the past as well as roles in modern warfare. Participate in group scavenger hunt to answer questions and develop team building.
